Youth Programmer – Youth Skills

The Youth Programmer works with a driven and creative Youth Services team to develop and facilitate workshops, and support youth in the Youth Skills program at Frog Hollow Neighbourhood House. Youth Skills is a leadership and community engagement program for BIPOC youth aged 15-30 living in East Vancouver. This program is designed to fill gaps in life skills and leadership training, community service, and create a space for youth to connect with others experiencing similar life experiences. The program consists of ten 2 hour workshops and tailored support for youth to complete up to 120 hours of volunteer service. The next cohort begins in early 2024. This position requires a combination of in-person work at Frog Hollow Neighbourhood House and Drive Youth Employment Services, with the option of remote work once the candidate is onboarded. Some evening work is required. This is a Short Term position with 4% in lieu of vacation time.

Position:	Youth Programmer – Youth Skills
Hours:	Approximately 20 hours per week
Starting Wage:	ANHBC Band P4 - \$22.90-25.38/hour
Contract Date:	ASAP – April 2023 (with possibility of extension)

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Plan, prepare and facilitate Youth Skills program in collaboration with community partners, guest speakers, and Youth Services Coordinator
- Promote the program within the community and on social media and recruit BIPOC youth aged 15-30
- Support the work of, and collaborate with, the Youth Services team to ensure smooth implementation and operations
- Plan for and purchase program supplies and food in accordance with the program budget
- Collect and record required forms, information, and data for reporting as required
- Ensure safety protocols are adhered to, programs are engaging, accessible, and inclusive, and that program goals are met
- Participate in regular staff meetings and staff training
- Provide a physically and emotionally safe environment for all program participants, staff and volunteers
- Support operations at Drive Youth Employment Services, Frog Hollow's youth satellite office, including staffing our resource room which supports youth with employment services and promotes Frog Hollow's youth programs
- Additional duties as assigned by supervisor
